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NAKURU COUNTY SUPPLEMENTARY APPROPRIATION BILL No.2 OF 2017

(BY LEAVE OF HOUSE)

The Chairperson (Hon. David Malel): Thank you honourable Members, be seated! This is a short Bill and I want you to be seated we finish very quickly and we depart.

The Chairperson (Hon. David Malel): In the First Schedule, there are some amendments and I want to call upon the mover to read all the amendments that are in that First Schedule

First Schedule: Additions**Hon. Beatrice Wambugu:** Amendments

THAT recurrent expenditure (R02) of the department of Agriculture be amended by increasing Veterinary Supplies and Materials by Kshs. 1,345,680 this been occasioned by additional allocation of Kshs. 4,000,000 beside other reallocations.

THAT recurrent expenditure (R03) of the department of Health be amended by increasing salaries and allowances for the health workers by Kshs. 30, 127,527,921 this been occasioned by additional allocation of Kshs. 60, 127,921 to cater for the increased salaries and allowances from the conclusion of their negotiated CBA. The other difference arose from the reallocation within departments to provide for the increased salaries and allowances.

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THAT recurrent expenditure (R04) of the department of environment be amended by increasing allocation for casual workers Kshs. 10,000,000. This increases the allocation from 65 million to 75 million. The reduction seen resulted from the committee rationalization from the earlier proposed addition of Kshs 20.8 to Kshs 10 million

Development expenditure

THAT development expenditure (D02) of the department of Agriculture is amended by increasing the allocation for projects by Kshs. 1,100,000. This arose from the Honorable Members' reallocation of their ward project

THAT development expenditure (D03) of the Department of Health is amended by increasing conditional allocation for level five hospital by Kshs 93 million and the difference been accounted for by the projects reallocation by honorable Members.

THAT development expenditure (D04) of the department of Environment is amended by increasing the allocation for projects by Kshs. 6,000,000 to read Kshs. 23,200,000. This arose from Honorable Members' reallocation of their ward project

THAT development expenditure (D05) of the department of Education is amended by increasing the allocation for projects by Kshs. 974,724. This arose from the Honorable Members' reallocation of their ward project (Been reallocation for Waseges ward completion of Wuimiririe ECD classroom)

THAT development expenditure (D07) of the department of Roads is amended by reducing the allocation for projects by Kshs.6, 600,000.

THAT development expenditure (D09) of the department of Trade is amended by increasing the allocation for projects by Kshs.3, 000,000. This arose from Honorable Members' reallocation of their various ward projects.

THAT recurrent expenditure (R05) of the department of education be amended by reducing it by Kshs. 37,327,921 to read Kshs. 56,140,585. This arose after the Committee suspended recruitment of ECDE teachers whose budgetary allocation was transferred to cater for health workers revised remunerations.

THAT recurrent expenditure (R08) of the department of public service management be amended by reducing it by Kshs. 9,999,997. This arose after the Committee suspended recruitment of village administrators whose budgetary allocation was transferred to cater for health workers revised remunerations.

Development Expenditure

THAT capital expenditure (R02) of the department of Agriculture is amended by deleting the entire vote.

THAT development expenditure (R05) of the department of Education is amended by reducing allocation for projects by Kshs 13,024,774. This arose from the honorable Member's reallocation of their ward projects.

THAT development expenditure (D06) of the department of Lands is amended by increasing the allocation for projects by Kshs. 5,600,000 to read. This arose from the Honorable Members' reallocation of their ward projects.

Hon Joseph Lang'at: Mr. Deputy Speaker Sir, on Standing Order 36(i) I wish to rise and seek leave, to move the adjournment of this House for the purpose of discussing the strike which...

The Deputy Speaker (Hon James Tuei): Order Hon Lang'at! Come up clearly

Hon Joseph Lang'at: I am saying Mr. Deputy Speaker, that pursuant to Standing Order 36 (i) I wish to rise and seek leave to move the adjournment of the House Business for the purpose of discussing Health Workers strike in our county. There is a go-slow strike in our health institutions and as it is, we need to discuss as a matter of County importance so that we do not lose our patients. So I wish to interrupt the business.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon James Tuei): Thank you; hon Beatrice

Hon Beatrice Wambugu: Thank you Mr. Deputy Speaker, unless the honorable Member was not listening to what we have been doing just now, I think all the money that we have supplemented, we have taken a huge chunk to the health workers so that the strike can end. So Hon Lang'at if you have been following the discussion, through the Speaker, we stopped the employment of village administrators and enforcement officers to cater for the health workers of our county. So I think they are very well catered for.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon James Tuei): Thank you very much Hon Beatrice. I want to also to react on that and more so for highlighting the issues before the House. Hon Lang'at, I am not convinced because already we have passed the Bill that will actually cater for those striking doctors and I believe in the near future, it is good for you being the Chairman Health Services Committee, to highlight to the House on critical issues as early as possible. The Bill has been passed and you should stand and thank Members of this House for passing it and the Supplementary Budget that will cater for striking doctors.

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Hon Joseph Lang'at: Mr. Deputy Speaker Sir, It is not only money which makes people to go on strike but I want to thank Members for factoring the health workers salaries in the Supplementary Budget.

The Deputy Speaker (Hon James Tuei): I believe the key thing in this case is the money. Thank you Members we are adjourning until next week Tuesday at 2.30pm.
