**Hon. I also want to say thank you to my vice Chair Mheshimiwa Karuri, all Members of Budget Committee, the Office of the Speaker and the Office of the Clerk for the support you have accorded to us during our very tedious exercise from the time we started deliberating on this Report. Thank you very much Mr. Speaker. I beg to table.

### MOTION

NAKURU COUNTY WARD DEVELOPMENT BILL NO. 2 OF 2014

(SECOND READING)

**Hon. Moses Kamau:** Thank you Mr. Speaker, I beg to move a Motion;-

THAT the Nakuru County Ward Development Fund Bill No. 2, 2014, be now read a Second Time. Mr. Speaker, this is one of the agenda that has been in Budget Committee and as I earlier said, I want to thank honourable Members of this Committee and also the Offices of the Speaker and the Clerk. Mr. Speaker, as you remember, the concept of Devolution in Article 174 and 175, the Constitution was planning to devolve resources from the National Government to County Governments and from the County Governments to the grass roots levels where the smallest unit of the County Government is the ward.

Mr. Speaker, I want to categorically state that these are not resources for the MCAs because some of the electorate are demonizing the whole idea as if the resources are for the MCAs. What we are doing is decentralising the resources to the smallest unit of the County which is the ward. In fact in this Bill, we want to share the resources that have been given by the National Government through the equitable share and local revenue for development.

Mr. Speaker, we have been having a tradition from the past where we have been sharing resources equally in the same ward. And we have one ward that has around 600square km, another one has 5square km. So we are devolving this equitably and also anchoring this into the law.

In the past Mr. Speaker, we were negotiating how we were going to allocate resources at the grass root levels which was a very tedious exercise because every Financial Year the Budget Committee and this House had to negotiate whether we were getting resources or not.

If there was a stalemate as you see in other Counties where the Executive can say there are no resources, then there would be no resources to that ward.

But Mr. Speaker because this is a House of Legislation, we are saying that it is important to have equitable share of resources at grass root levels; one for development and one for bursary. You know we have been having a lot of issues in issuing bursaries. Also in sports, during campaigns all these *waheshimiwa* including the Governor used millions buying our youths sports gear. We now want to tell them that we have legislated as MCAs that there is resources for sports that will be going to the grass root level, so that during campaigns the same youth will not see as if we are using them only during the campaigns but we are allocating resources for them.

Mr. Speaker, we have people with disabilities and during the public participation, in all the sub counties, these people have been coming out crying and requesting the leadership of this County to allocate resources for them.

When it comes to the environment, we need to support from the grass root level and we need to plant trees in those areas, and the Committee on Budget thought that it is very important to consider several parameters to devolve these resources; population, area square and equal share per ward.

Mr. Speaker, I want to say that this is one of the best Bill that we have and we are going to be in the books of history that we did the best for Nakuru County. I now call my vice Chair *mheshimiwa* Karuri to second the Motion.

**Hon. Joel Maina:** Thank you Mr. Speaker, I rise to second the Motion. The Bill before the floor of the House is one of the most progressive Bill ever passed in Africa and even in this nation since devolution started.

Mr. Speaker, devolution is how resources are going to be distributed and there can never be devolution if we are not talking about resource distribution.

Mr. Speaker, by passing this Bill, we want to avoid uncertainties. We do not want to be in a situation where people on the ground are not going to know exactly what will happen in the next Financial Year. We want a situation whereby they can project. That the people and the leadership in this County are able to project that in the coming Financial Year or five Financial Years, that this amount of money will come to the ground. And for these reasons they can participate in development planning and expenditure of these monies.

Mr. Speaker, even as we talk about distribution of resources, we want to avoid a situation where maybe only one area of this County benefits. We want a situation whereby Mau Narok will benefit as much as Eburu Mbaruk would and not only benefit but benefit equitably. This is one of the most progressive principle of this Bill. By doing this, the people will be able to realise the value of government and the importance of devolution.

Mr. Speaker, much has been said about this Bill. On a lighter note, that the MCAs want to be the Sheriffs of this County. This is not the correct position. The correct position is, this is centred on *Wanjiku*. It is centred on people. The development projects that are going to be realised through this Bill are not for the MCAs. They are for the residents of this great County. And for the first time in this County, the people will own the process, own the development agenda, own their County in terms of resources and are going to be empowered through this Bill. Thank you Mr. Speaker, I beg to second.

**The Speaker** (Hon. Joel Kairu): Thank you, I open the Motion for debate. Honourable Ayabei.

**Hon. Douglas Ayabei:** Thank you Mr. Speaker, I have heard the Chairman Budget honourable Musa move this Motion for debate. I want to believe this Motion should have been an early Christmas for the residents of Nakuru County. In fact, this is the best thing ever to happen through devolution. In this Motion, we are going to actualise the true meaning of devolution in the sense that this Bill is intended to devolve resources to the lowest level possible.

Mr. Speaker, I am impressed by this Bill in the sense that, it is sharing resources in an equitable manner.

Mr. Speaker, we all know the diversity of the County and that it is not equal in terms of development. For instance, the ward I represent that is Mariashoni, has been marginalised for many years but I can now smile as I contribute to this Motion because at last we have a chance to catch up with the rest. I can compare the wards in this County Mr. Speaker to people sitting on a platform where others are on a high platform and others like us in Mariashoni are on a lower platform. I am happy that we are not the ones pulling the ones up down but holding the hands of those who are down like us and lifting them up through this Bill which has created a way of distributing resources in a very equitable manner.

Mr. Speaker, as we contribute, the essence, as honourable Karuri has said is to devolve funds and I do not want people to tie this thing to MCAs. In fact Mr. Speaker, I have read through this Bill and it has completely detached the MCA or politics for that matter from this Bill, I am so happy that implementation of this Bill is going to be based on the people and basically on representation through other agents like the Ward Administrators and so forth, in fact the only role the MCA plays is oversight and to me it is a very good Bill and I beg to support.

**Majority Leader** (Hon. Stanley Karanja): I take this opportunity to thank the Committee on Budget and Appropriation because we have always been saying that there is always a thesis to a non-thesis, such that we used to have money allocated on the basis of how close are you to the executive such if you are closer to the executives development comes, it is almost automatic that this Bill has brought development to Nakuru County such that if you are far or closer to the County headquarters you will still get development and that is why we thank the Committee and your office for the support they gave this Bill.

Members of Budget Committee and this House have gone into history and we are happy because we are the first Assembly to come with the formula that will see the citizens in our wards benefit on the issues of water and roads that can be discussed through public participation and act on them. It is a Bill that has completely brought us closer to the people and I beg that when we are contributing to this Bill we make sure that we do all that pertains to it to see that we are closer to the people than before.

I thank the Committee because this Bill has had a long journey and it would have been put into asunder, and through this Bill this House will be united and those who will be coming after us will be referring to this Bill as a denominator for development, I beg to support.

**The Speaker** (Hon. Joel Kairu): Thank You, honorable Malel, let's take the shortest time possible because there so many Members who want to contribute.

**Hon. David Malel:** Thank you, as I support this Bill it is also good that I inform the newly elected and nominated Members how we started. In 2013 the very same thirty percent of development was distributed to wards that saw a ward in Naivasha getting eight million and a ward in Nakuru Biashara getting eighty seven million and that is why we came up with the equal share of the resources but it was also against the law because even the Commission of Revenue Allocation(CRA) was distributing the same amount of money equitably. This Bill solves the

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problem of that “you must be good to the governor” , the bad “*sura*” type like Honorable Malel may not be the good type that may go to the governors side and kneel down...

*(Laughter)*

This Bill will solve those issues and it will make us honorable Members because, regardless of whichever stand you take, because this is politics we agree to disagree on issues but that does not mean we are enemies, it is only the ideas that we have that may not be same with the one the other Members has.

With this Bill, it is also good to note that we are not getting resources from the governor, we are only getting seventeen percent and the thirteen percent is already with the governor and he is going to do the flagship projects, and I do not know how he is going to do it because when I get the seventeen percent to my ward which is around thirty million, the governor is supposed to bring another fifteen million as a flagship project to my ward if he is to distribute equitably his kitty.

Otherwise we are assisting the governor so much by getting smaller issues that concerns the people solved by the same development money, thank you.

**Hon. Joel Maina:** (On a Point of Information) thank you, I want to inform honorable Malel that it is not seventeen percent but twenty five percent of the last audited accounts.

**The Speaker** (Hon. Joel Kairu): Honorable Kajwang

**Hon. Peter Kajwang:** Thank you Mr. Speaker, I stand to support this Bill and I also want to congratulate the Committee on Budget and Appropriation for bringing a Bill which we can say that it is a milestone to devolution. The purpose of devolution was to bring resources to the people and when devolution was impressed and anchored in our constitution and the people at the grassroots level have never come to realize the fruits of devolution because there were no clear-cuts on how this resources are going to reach them.

This Assembly is going into record for having brought life into the concept of devolution and will make the citizens to appreciate the effect that devolution was actually meant for good services brought nearer to them.

I want to appreciate the Committee for having brought up the issue of equity in sharing of the resources, the issue of population was very paramount and I must say that it has been captured well for it has been given the correct weight which is thirty percent as compared to the parameter of the geographical cover, I want to say that in future we may make this Bill better when we bring in other parameters like poverty index so that eventually we get proper equitable formula that will bring justice and equitable distribution of resources to the grassroots level, thank you and I beg to support.

**Hon. John Ngugi:** Thank you, I stand to support the Bill because before we had something similar to this but it was not legalized so what we are doing here is legalizing the same. I want to say that, that is the best way we can work for our people and I can give an example that in the former regime there were some MCAs that used to differ politically with the governor and the governor will punish that MCA by denying that ward resources, but this Bill that we are going to pass today, it does not matter whether you differ with the governor or whatever happens, people from that ward must benefit.

If you look at the Bill, it has taken into consideration a lot of things because we are talking about population, square kilometers and that we are saying it is equitable to all wards and it will challenge the executive arm to collect more revenue because we must cater for the same, thank you

**The Speaker** (Hon. Joel Maina): Thank you, the Member from Kiptororo

**Hon. Richard Kibet:** Thank you, I stand to support the Bill because it is a success for all of us and when you look at the Bill it has factored in some of the parameters like population, area in square kilometers and equitable share, my ward is around three hundred kilometers square and I know I will be able to get some revenue through the equitable distribution of resources and also the Bill will be our common denominator for our success.

I concur with Members who have contributed before me that this Bill will make the County of Nakuru shine again and in my ward because the people usually tell me not to allow the resources to be shared equally but equitably, I plead that we support this Motion and what we have been given should reach the people and should be done on time and in an efficient manner, thank I support the Motion.

**The Speaker** (Hon. Joel Kairu): Thank You, Honorable Gathereki

**Hon. Josephat Mwangi:** Thank you, may I first commend the Chairperson and the Members of Budget Committee for this noble Bill and also appreciate the work done by the previous County Assembly, I am aware they had a gentleman's agreement with the previous executive but it had not been anchored into law. As we formalize this one today, marginalized areas will be well catered for, a quite number of parameters have been considered and this will motivate the people as they pay tax to the county government because most of the projects done in the previous Assembly or county government were shoddily done, halfway done or not yet implemented.

This one will motivate because once the projects are initiated, they shall be initiated for posterity and once the Bill is through and enacted as law the people will know that the funds will be available and will be able to identify projects and ensure they are implemented to the final stage and it will take this county to the next level as we lobby for more from the county and national government. I beg to support.

**The Speaker** (Hon. Joel Kairu): Thank you, honorable Jebichii and then Honorable Palang'a.

**Hon. Irene Chebichii:** Thank you, I want to say that I do support this wonderful Bill and I would like to congratulate the Committee on Budget and Appropriation for working tirelessly to make sure that this Bill has been brought for discussion, first of all I want to say that I will be one of the Members who will be very happy when this Bill will be passed . One of the reasons I am supporting this Motion is because of the current structures of allocation of resources in our Wards. Currently you know we have been doing things in a way that some wards have not been benefiting from the County resources. Currently we are allocated Kshs 20m which is not enough.

This Bill has also considered issues of population in each area and also issues of basic equal shares. As you understand we come from various wards which have different dynamics. Like my Ward, the population is not bad but the area itself is so big. We are also covering lands occupied by the whites and before you transverse that land there should be a root therefore there should be a prepared road.

Also the area we are representing, the land area is big. We should make sure we have more dispensaries so that our people can access good medical care, we have to build ECD structures for our young ones within their surrounding so that we do not punish them to travel for a long distances to access education.

Another thing is the allocation to the disabled, sports and bursaries. As you can see the allocation have increased, the people living with disabilities have been coming to our offices to look for help and we have not been in a position to help them because we never had good structure to cater for their needs.

Also on issues to do with sports, recently there was a schedule that was prepared by the Executive and was given to our sub counties representative of sports. They were told to make sure that they come up with teams from ward levels and they were not facilitated at all.

Issues of sports have been well catered for and that means we are going to empower our youth who have talents which have not been utilized well.

On issues of bursaries, currently we were issuing bursaries and I was so surprised to receive over 5000 filled forms and I was allocated Kshs 1m. I was wondering which criteria I am going to use to allocate this money to those who have applied for them. I can see the issue is taken care of because I can see the amount has increased abit. But we are hoping in future things will be better.

I am therefore urging Members to support this Bill and ask the Governor to also assent to it because I hope the Chairman of the Committee is preparing for the CIDP so that when we will be going to the grassroots to do public participation we will do as per this Bill. Thank you.

**The Speaker** (Hon. Joel Kairu): Hon. Palang'a then we give it to Hon. Mauche, ooh yours have been said, so you are okay now, then we go to Hon. Karanja.

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**Hon. Peter Palang'a:** Thank you Mr. Speaker Sir, for according me this opportunity to contribute...

*(Loud Consultation)*

Mr. Speaker protect me, there is a lot of consultations

**The Speaker** (Hon. Joel Kairu): Order! Order Members

**Hon. Peter Palang'a:** I am in support of this Bill. A lot have been mentioned in terms of parameters that have been used, so my contribution will be a little different from them but in support of the Bill.

There are things that have made me support this Bill, number one, there is going to be an establishment of Ward development committee. In my view with such arrangement, in the past we have had a situation whenever a project has been implemented some people have not been aware of the very project being implemented by the County Government.

but with such establishment of such Committee they are going to have the ownership of such projects. These members together with other stakeholders are going to ensure the projects have been implemented to the latter and so have confidence and faith with the County Government. This makes me feel that this is the right direction to go.

There is the Public Finance Act that provides for certain percentages for development against other operations. the Law says we need to have 31 percent I am very certain with such arrangement we are going to achieve this and there should not be an audit query at any point by the office of the auditor general.

Another version is whereby we are going to have efficiency and effectiveness of the projects and the time bound. Previously and Members can attest to this we have had situations where projects have been budgeted for but there have been delays in implementation of these projects.

I want to believe we are going to have signatory of these accounts drawn from the line ministry and other people from the wards. I have no doubt that these projects are going to be implemented very promptly and very efficiently. I stand here supporting that this is the right direction we are taking as a County.

I am aware that there are some other counties which started implementing such approaches sometimes back, for example Bungoma, Trans Nzoia and Kisumu are doing this and their projects are completed on time because money is set aside unlike the way we keep on depending on whether money is going to be allocated by the National treasury.



Lastly when this particular fund is going to be there we will not have quarrels with the Executive because money is set aside already, we will not operate at the mercies of somebody who decides if the projects are going to happen or not.

Last year and I do not know whether it is because I was from the other side of the government or why, but a project was being implemented in my ward and I only heard about it from other people, I was not even consulted. This will put us in equal bars and Members of this County will enjoy equal distribution of resources.

We are headed the right way and as it is the back now stops with Implementation Committee and the Governor to assent to the Bill. God Bless you and I know at the end of the day members of olkaria ward are going to enjoy these benefits. Thank you.

**The Speaker** (Hon. Joel Kairu): Thank you, Hon. Karanja then we can have Hon. Mawawa then Hon. Eddy Kiragu to close.

**Hon. Peter Mburu:** Thank you Mr. Speaker, I am so delighted to be part of history, to be part of the Assembly that is going to pass a Bill that marks a milestone in line with our 2010 Constitution.

This is a process that started twenty years ago through a process of inter political parliamentary group that saw Kenyans shed blood and sacrifice their lives so that devolution can be realized at the grassroots.

As we were doing our campaigns during the 2017 elections we saw the challenges at the ground and I want to appreciate that our President recognizes that MCAs are the true drivers of devolution because we understand the problems at grassroots level, from health care, roads, ECDs, environment, market and waste management and I believe through empowerment by giving us the allocation of revenue which is collected in our County and National Government we are going to realise the dream that *Wanjiku* has always wanted to be involved in this process of being able to make decisions on matters that affect the grassroots.

I am very happy to be part of this historic Bill and I am very happy to be part of the Committee and our Chairman Hon. Musa that we are able to table a Bill that is going to change and affect the people at the grassroots level.

**The Speaker** (Hon. Joel Kairu): yes Hon. Mary Waiganjo

**Hon. Mary Waiganjo:** Thank you Mr. Speaker, sir, for giving me this opportunity to contribute to this Bill. I support this Bill because now as oversight the executive has work to do because there is something we can base our argument on as we ensure our wards are developed.

Previously there were issues that were there but only on paper, some wards got almost nothing in bursaries, the disabled have all through had money that did not exist and even in sports the only thing that people got were uniforms.

The other issue is whether elected or nominated all of us are development conscious and that is what makes us part of the history of Nakuru that we were part of the people who passed this Bill that is going to change Nakuru positively. I would wish to be part of this and therefore I support this Motion.

I also want to congratulate the Budget Committee under the leadership of Hon. Musa for a job well done.

**The Speaker** (Hon. Joel Kairu): Thank you. Hon. Eddy. I will only give two more that is Hon. from Mai Mahiu then Hon. Catherine.

**The Speaker** (Hon Joel Kairu): Hon Eddy

**Hon Eddy Wambui:** Mr. Speaker, Sir, Firstly I want to appreciate you and your leadership for having gazetted this Bill and for giving us an opportunity to come and discuss this worthy Bill. Secondly I want to acknowledge the effort of my Chair Hon Moses and his deputy Hon Karuri and the Committee Members and my fellow members that is a well done job. This Bill, Mr. Speaker, Sir, is not for Eddy Kiragu in Nakuru Town East Constituency and it is not for Hon Palang'a in Naivasha constituency and it is not for Hon Moses in Gilgil Constituency. It is a Bill of the people for the people and by the people. It is not a Bill for individuals but it is for all the people and neither is it a Bill for this County Assembly but also a Bill for the Governor and his leadership. What we will deliver will be a score card to the Governor himself. So we are kindly asking the Governor to assent to this Bill that we know the majority are supporting it. It is long overdue but again we cannot complain.

This is the second Assembly with a purpose of ensuring that we are fulfilling what we promised our people. I am a happy man today having seen the issue of sports being considered, being the chair, we appreciate such a worthy amount to cater for the youth within our constituencies and at the ward level. Many youth have been affected by drug abuse and we have talents that need to be nurtured and to achieve that we need money. We have to support youth with talents by giving them opportunity to put food on the table, to have their homes and ensure that they live decent lives.

Again, this Bill is touching on issue of equality having given 60 per cent on equal allocation, is a fundamental aspect because all are catered for which is very important. Before I sit down, I am requesting my colleagues to support it because it will help us forge way forward towards greatness. And therefore responsibility is required to the fullest and the price of greatness is responsibility. Let us take responsibility in ensuring that this Bill is assented and I believe the Governor is ready to receive this Bill because it is for us all. Kindly Speaker put it to question.

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**The Speaker** (Hon Joel Kairu): Hon Ng’ethe from Mai Mahiu

**Hon Stephen Ng’ethe:** Thank you Mr. Speaker and I do hereby rise in support of the Motion. Truth is that there is a lot of verbal diarrhea outside there informed by ignorance; there is a lot of desertification of good and crucial information regarding the same. Honorable Members we have a borne to crack with Wanjiku and the media by informing them properly what this Bill entails. This is an economic prosperity program and thus entails that this Bill should be adopted. Good budgetary tenets have been abused, the other day the Breton Woods institutions warned Kenya and they said that very soon they may withdraw their funding basically because we have not respected their 70:30 ratio, 70 for recurrent and 30 for development. There is no function here that has been transferred, the Governor is the chief implementer with the passage or not of this Bill. Therefore, the Assembly has a business to do in ensuring that there is 70 per cent and 30 per cent so that this ballooning wage bill, which now is around 90 percent for Nakuru. Functionary 10 to 15 percent goes to development and that is why we have so many contractors who have not been paid because basically we interfered with the development kitty. We have to help the Governor because right now you realize that the fuel price is high. What informs this? Because the government promised and it has to fulfill their pledges and because the rise in price of fuel does not correspond to the rise in price of crude oil, prudent management of resources must be put in place. Thank you Mr. Speaker.

**The Speaker** (Hon Joel Kairu): Hon Catherine

**Hon Catherine Kamau:** I stand to support the Motion and to start with is to congratulate the Budget Committee for coming up with this good work. The reason why I support the Motion is that being nominated, definitely I represent the Turi Ward and not only me but all of us the nominated Members represent our wards within our county. I see a good representation when it comes to bursaries for our children, the people living with disabilities have been considered and thirdly we have the youth. We are supporting them through sports. Another thing I feel I support this Motion is because a project management has five basic phases and there is a very important aspect of it in that if we pass this Bill we will have these projects implemented. When a project is executed in our different wards, we will have work done down there and our constituents will be also engaged and maybe some will get job opportunities. I support this Motion for those reasons I have mentioned and being a nominated Member from Turi I feel it will help us down there and I have no reason to object.

**The Speaker** (Hon Joel Kairu): Hon Jack from Mau Narok

**Hon Jackson Githua:** Asante sana Mheshimiwa Spika. Kwanza nasimama kuunga mkono mswada huu ambapo leo ni siku ya furaha kwangu ambapo hili jambo nimelisubiri. Hata wakati nilipokuwa sijachaguliwa kama mjumbe, ningependa kushukuru bunge hili la Nakuru na pia kamati ya Bajeti kwa kazi nzuri ambayo wamefanya hasa kuangazia raslimali zikisambazwa mashinani ili kusaidia wananchi pale.

Huu mswada umewapa wananchi uhuru wa kupendekeza miradi ile wangetaka itekelezwe mashinani. Hapo awali tulikuwa tumegeuzwa kuwa waombaji na ili miradi kutekelezwa ulikuwa uende upige magoti ili miradi itekelezwe mashinani. Huu mswada utatuhakikishia maendeleo mashinani na ni jambo ya kupigiwa upato. Pia hatutakuwa watu wa kupelekewa maendeleo ambayo hatuhitaji kwetu. Katika mfumo uliopita, kama kwangu mashinani nimepata maendeleo fulani imetekelezwa kwa mfano Naivasha unapata yameletwa kwangu ilhali niko na miradi ambayo ni ya dharura kuliko hiyo. Mwananchi wana nafasi ya kuchagua miradi itakayofaidi yeye mwenyewe.

Pia tukiangalia katika maswala ya raslimali, vyombo na mali ambayo itanunuliwa chini ya hii mfumo kupitia msawada huu wa pesa mashinani tunaona hii itakuwa mali ya kaunti itaboreshwa katika wadi zote. Kwa hivyo wananchi watafurahi na kulinda mali wakijua ni yao. Hapo awali wangengoja mali kutoka makao makuu ya kaunti na ingechukua muda mrefu. Ningehimiza Mheshimiwa Gavana atie sahihi mswada huu ili kazi ianze mashinani bila ubaguzi.

**Hon Wilbur Amara:** Mr. Speaker, Sir, I also stand to support this Bill. I know honorable Members have given 110 percent why they support the Bill. I also feel that it should go into record that the member of Kivumbini and Minority Leader in Nakuru County Assembly is also supporting the Bill and that is the reason I have stood to contribute to the Motion. It would be wrong not to be in *Hansard* for supporting this Bill. It has taken care of both the Majority and the minority. Thank you
